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National Hockey League

The National Hockey League (NHL) is a professional ice hockey League comprised of 30 teams in North America. It is considered the premier professional ice hockey league in the world and one of North America's major professional sports leagues. The Stanley Cup, the oldest professional sports trophy in North America, is awarded annually to the League champion at the end of each season.



The league was formed in 1917 in Montreal, Quebec, Canada from a predecessor organization, the National Hockey Association (NHA), founded in 1909. It started with four teams, and through series of expansions, contractions and relocations, the league is now composed of 30 teams, 24 of which are based in the United States and six in Canada. After a labor dispute that led to the cancellation of the entire 2004–05 season, the league has staged a growth in revenue, profit, and popularity.¹

The NHL attracts highly skilled players from all over the world; the League currently has players from about 20 different countries. Historically, the Canadians have constituted over half of the players in the NHL because both the sport and the League originated in Canada and its overall popularity within the country's culture. However, over the past 25 years, the percentage of United States and European players in the NHL has steadily increased. This can be directly attributed to the NHL's continued expansion of the sport around the United States, its superiority in quality of competition compared to other ice hockey leagues, as well as the availability of highly skilled European players.

History^{2 3}

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After a series of disputes in the Canadian National Hockey Association (NHA) the owners of the Montreal Canadiens, Montreal Wanderers, Ottawa Senators, and Quebec Bulldogs met at the Windsor Hotel in Montreal to talk about the NHA's future. Their discussions eventually led to the creation of the National Hockey League on November 22, 1917. Three former NHA franchises, the Canadiens, Wanderers and Senators were founding members of the NHL, along with a new Toronto franchise.

Even though the league struggled to stay in business during its first decade, the NHL's teams were very successful on the ice; only once, in 1925, did a team from any other league win the Stanley Cup and by 1926 the NHL was the only league competing for the Cup. The NHL then started a process of expansion: the Boston Bruins (the first U.S.-based NHL franchise) and Montreal Maroons entered the league in 1924–25; the New York Americans and the Pittsburgh

Pirates entered in the 1925–26 season; and the New York Rangers, Chicago Black Hawks (now spelled Blackhawks), and Detroit Cougars (now known as the Red Wings) entered in the 1926–27 season, raising the number of teams in the NHL to an even ten.

The Great Depression and World War II took a financial toll on the league and by 1942 the NHL contracted to just six teams. These six teams (the Montreal Canadiens, Toronto Maple Leafs, Detroit Red Wings, Chicago Black Hawks, Boston Bruins, and New York Rangers) are collectively known as the Original Six, and for the next quarter-century were the only teams in the National Hockey League.

By the mid 1960s, the desire for a network television contract in the U.S., and concerns that the Western Hockey League was planning to declare itself a major league and challenge for the Stanley Cup, spurred the NHL to undertake its first expansion since the 1920s. Six expansion teams were added to the NHL roster in 1967, and were placed in their own newlycreated division. Two teams each were added in California, Pennsylvania, and the Mississippi River valley. The teams were the Los Angeles Kings, Oakland Seals (later folded), Pittsburgh Penguins, Philadelphia Flyers, Minnesota North Stars (Dallas Stars since 1993), and St. Louis Blues. Three years later, the NHL added the Vancouver Canucks and Buffalo Sabres.

In 1972, the World Hockey Association (WHA) was formed, the first potential rival to the NHL in decades. Although it was at first publicly dismissed as a threat by the NHL owners, the NHL decided to rush its own expansion plans in 1972 by adding the New York Islanders and Atlanta Flames (which became the Calgary Flames in 1980) to forestall WHA franchises in newly constructed arenas in those markets, followed by the addition of the Kansas City Scouts (which became the Colorado Rockies in 1976 before becoming the New Jersey Devils in 1982) and Washington Capitals two years later. The two leagues fought for the rights of players and fans until the WHA folded in 1979



as part of an agreement whereby four of the remaining six WHA teams would enter the NHL as expansion teams: the Hartford Whalers (the Carolina Hurricanes since 1997), Québec Nordiques (the Colorado Avalanche since 1995), Edmonton Oilers, and Winnipeg Jets (the Phoenix Coyotes since 1996).

After a period of stability in the 1980s, the NHL further expanded with nine new franchises in ten years. The San Jose Sharks entered in 1991; a season later the Ottawa Senators would return to the NHL along with the addition of the Tampa Bay Lightning. In 1993, the league added two more expansion franchise, the Mighty Ducks of Anaheim and the Florida Panthers. Finally, the Nashville Predators in 1998, the Atlanta Thrashers in 1999, and then the Minnesota Wild and the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2000, bringing the total to the current level of 30 teams.

Past Labor Issues

There have been three league-wide work stoppages due to labor disputes in NHL history, all happening between 1992 and 2005. The first was a strike by the National Hockey League Players Association in April 1992 which lasted for 10 days, but the strike was settled quickly and all affected games were rescheduled. A lockout at the start of the 1994–95 season forced the league to reduce the schedule from 84 games to just 48, with the teams playing only intraconference games during the reduced season. The resulting collective bargaining agreement was set for renegotiation in 1998 and extended to September 15, 2004.

With no new agreement in hand when its player contract expired on September 15, 2004, League commissioner Gary Bettman announced a lockout of the players union and cessation of operations by the NHL head office. The lockout shut down the league for 310 days, the longest in sports history; the NHL was the first professional sports league to lose an entire season. The new collective bargaining agreement was ratified in July 2005 with a term of six years with an option of extending the collective bargaining agreement for an additional year at the end of the term, allowing the NHL to resume as of the 2005–06 season.⁴

On October 6, 2005, the first post-lockout NHL season took to the ice with 15 games. Of those 15 games, over 10 were before sell out crowds. The NHL achieved record attendance in the 2005–06 season, generating over 20 millions fans and averaging 16,955 per game in League wide attendance, a 1.2% increase over the previous mark held in the 2001–02 season. That season the Montreal Canadiens, Calgary Flames, Colorado Avalanche, Minnesota Wild, and the Vancouver Canucks all sold out their home games; all six Canadian teams played to 98% capacity or better at home games that season. Over 75% of the clubs finished even or ahead of their 2003–04 attendance mark. The Pittsburgh Penguins had the highest attendance increase at 33%, mainly because of 18-year-old hockey sensation, first overall draft pick Sidney Crosby.⁵ Yet, even after losing a season to a labor dispute in 2005, overall attendance figures for League teams has returned to solid ground and the League has clearly demonstrated its sustainable popularity with its fans even during difficult times involving labor disputes and a long absence of play.

League-wide Cost Certainty ⁶⁷

The NHL Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") is the basic contract between the National Hockey League (NHL) team owners and the NHL Players Association (NHLPA), designed to be arrived at through the typical process of labor-management negotiations. The most recent agreement, reached on July 13, 2005, was ratified by the NHLPA membership on July 21 and by the League's Board of Governors on July 22.

The previous agreement was signed back in 1995 following a lockout which shortened the 1994–95 NHL season to 48 games, a loss of 36 games from what had originally been an 84game schedule. None of the games scheduled for the 1994 segment of the season were ever played, the lockout lasting until after the beginning of 1995. The CBA was initially to last for six seasons and be open to re-negotiation in 1998, but was eventually extended to last until September 15, 2004 (one day after the World Cup of Hockey final in Toronto).

On the expiration date of the old agreement, the NHL Board of Governors, representing ownership, met and unanimously decided that the 2004–05 NHL season would be delayed until a new CBA was in place. The owners' lockout of players began at 12:01 a.m. on September 16, 2004, the day most NHL training camps would have opened had the NHLPA and the NHL come to an agreement.

An important provision of the new CBA is an overall salary cap for all NHL teams, tied directly to League revenues. The agreement also phases in a reduced time limit in which a player is designated a "veteran" player and therefore eligible for free agency, which will eventually give players unrestricted rights to negotiate with any team at age 27 or after 7 seasons in the NHL, whichever comes first. Highlights of the 2005 CBA are:

- CBA is a six year agreement ending at the conclusion of the 2010 2011 season.
- The players' collective compensation is set at 54% of League revenue, as defined, to the extent League revenues in any year are below \$2.2 billion; 55% when League revenues are between \$2.2 billion and \$2.4 billion; 56% when League revenues are between \$2.4 billion and \$2.7 billion, and 57% when League revenues in any year exceed \$2.7 billion.
- No player may be eligible to contract for or receive in excess of 20% of the Club's upper limit in total annual compensation (NHL salary plus signing, roster, reporting, and all performance bonuses). In 2005-06, no player will be permitted to contract for total compensation in excess of \$7.8 million in any year of his contract.

- The minimum NHL player salary in 2005-06 and 2006-07 will be \$450,000; \$475,000 in 2007-08 and 2008-09; \$500,000 in 2009-10 and 2010-11, and \$525,000 in 2011-12 (to the extent the CBA is extended by the Union).
- The League committed to enhanced revenue sharing among its member clubs in an amount and on terms that should allow all Clubs to fund a competitive team within the prescribed payroll limits. Clubs are eligible for revenue sharing: (1) are ranked in the bottom half (bottom 15) in League revenues, and (2) operate in markets with a Demographic Market Area of 2.5 million or fewer TV households.

Teams

The National Hockey League originated in 1917 with four teams, and through a sequence of franchise expansions, reductions, and relocations currently consists of 30 teams, 24 of which are based in the United States and six in Canada. The Montreal Canadiens are the most successful franchise with 24 Stanley Cup championships (23 as an NHL team, 1 as an NHA team); in the four major North American professional sports leagues the Montreal Canadiens are only surpassed in the number of championships by the New York Yankees of Major League Baseball, who have two more. The 1977 edition of the Montreal Canadiens, the second of four straight Stanley Cup champions, was named by ESPN as the second greatest sports team of alltime.

The current League organization divides the teams into two conferences. Each conference is separated into three divisions and each division with at least five teams. The current organization has roots in the 1998–99 season where League realignment added two divisions to bring the total number of divisions to six; the current team alignment began with the 2000–2001 season when the Minnesota Wild and the Columbus Blue Jackets joined the League as expansion teams.

Season Structure⁸

The National Hockey League season is divided into an exhibition season (September), a regular season (from the first week in October through early to mid April) of 82 games, and a postseason (the Stanley Cup playoffs). During the regular season, clubs play each other in a predefined schedule. The Stanley Cup playoffs, which go from April to the beginning of June, are an elimination tournament where two teams play against each other to win a best-of-seven series in order to advance to the next round. The final remaining team is crowned the Stanley Cup champion. Beginning in 2007, the NHL regular season has begun in Europe while teams not involved complete their exhibition schedule. The 2008–2009 season began with the Pittsburgh Penguins facing off against the Ottawa Senators in Stockholm, Sweden and the New York Rangers taking on the Tampa Bay Lightning in Prague, Czech Republic further expanding the NHL's international reach.

NHL Broadcasting

Canada

In Canada, National Hockey League games are aired nationally by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) and The Sports Network (TSN). Regional games are broadcast

by a number of networks including Rogers Sportsnet (RSN). French language games are broadcast by the Réseau des sports (RDS) and Réseau Info-Sports (RIS), but no longer on Radio-Canada (the French-language counterpart of the CBC), a change which has caused controversy in French Canada. The television program *Hockey Night in Canada*, usually aired Saturday nights on CBC, is a long-standing Canadian tradition dating back to 1952 and even prior to that on radio since the 1920s.¹¹

United States

In the United States NHL games are aired nationally by Versus (previously the "Outdoor Life Network" and "OLN"), and by NBC. NBC replaced the previous over-the-air network, ABC, and has a revenue-sharing agreement with the NHL. Versus replaced ESPN as the cable network; Comcast, which owns Versus, offered a two-year \$120 million agreement, while ESPN offered a revenue sharing agreement.¹³

Versus had about 20 million fewer subscribers than ESPN when the NHL started on Versus, but Comcast switched Versus from a digital tier to basic cable to make NHL games available to more cable subscribers. For Versus, the NHL coverage was a good addition as Versus' ratings grew by about 275% when it showed an NHL game.¹⁴

The 2007 Stanley Cup Finals were the lowest rated in the United States in history. As a whole, the television ratings on NBC were down 20% from the 2006 series, with Game 3's coverage on NBC garnering a mere 1.1 rating (approximately 1,205,600 households), making it the lowest rated prime-time broadcast in the network's history. However, coverage in Canada on CBC pulled in 2,608,000, 2,378,000, and 2,553,000 (for Games 1, 2, and 3 respectively), slightly higher than their numbers for the first three games in 2006. Comparatively, in 1994, when the New York Rangers were involved, Game 7 of the Stanley Cup finals posted a rating of 6.9.¹⁵

Although 2007 saw low Stanley Cup Finals ratings, the 2008 series between Detroit and Pittsburgh drew one of the highest Stanley Cup ratings ever with strong 4.4 as the high overnight rating.

XM Satellite Radio is the official satellite radio broadcaster of the NHL, as of July 1, 2007. Between September 2005 and June 2007, the NHL's broadcasting rights were shared with both XM and Sirius Satellite Radio and were broadcast on just Sirius before the NHL lockout.

XM used to broadcast more than 80% of NHL games, including all the playoffs and Stanley Cup Finals. Starting with the 2007–08 season, XM broadcasts every game.¹⁶

Glendale Arena opened its doors on December 26, 2003. The arena was built as a stateof-the-art, multi-purpose facility and anchors the 223-acre, \$1 billion development Westgate City Center - the "crown jewel" of sports and entertainment complexes. Westgate City Center development funded by millionaire New York architect Ron Elsensohn, which is going to be an entertainment and retail hub located around the arena; a 320-room Renaissance Hotel and Conference Center was recently completed on October 25, 2006, Jobing.com purchased the naming rights to the building and Glendale Arena was renamed Jobing.com Arena for a reported 10-year/\$30 million agreement.¹⁷

Owned by the City of Glendale, Jobing.com Arena is home to the National Hockey League's Phoenix Coyotes. Since opening, the arena has established itself as one of the premiere sports and entertainment venues in the country and has earned its place of distinction as "Arizona's must play."

With two separate concourses on two seating levels, Jobing.com Arena provides guests with non-restricted views of the action, a luxury that was not afforded the team at the America West Arena. The Arena also features an intimate seating bowl with all the modern amenities. Jobing.com Arena is a sports and entertainment arena located in Glendale, Arizona. It is home to the Phoenix Coyotes of the National Hockey League (NHL) and was home to the Arizona Sting of the National Lacrosse League (NLL). Completed in 2003, the arena cost \$180 million. It seats 17,799 for hockey and lacrosse. The arena sits across the street from University of Phoenix Stadium, the home of the NFL's Arizona Cardinals.¹⁸

Arena History

The arena's construction broke ground in 2002, and the Coyotes moved into the arena a year later in late 2003. The team spent its first several seasons since relocating from Winnipeg in 1996 in the America West Arena (now the US Airways Center) in downtown Phoenix. The AWA was not an old arena (it had made its debut as the new home of the NBA's Phoenix Suns only four years earlier, in 1992) but it was primarily designed for NBA basketball. It was quickly retrofitted for hockey. However, the arena floor was just barely large enough to fit a regulation hockey rink, and several seats had badly obstructed views. As a result, before the team's second season in Phoenix, it had to be cut down from over 18,000 seats to just over 16,000—the second-smallest capacity in the NHL at the time. After the Colorado Avalanche moved from the McNichols Sports Arena into the Pepsi Center in 1999, and the Toronto Maple Leafs moved from the Maple Leaf Gardens to Air Canada Centre later in the same season, America West Arena was the smallest NHL venue. A small section of seats on the lower level actually hung over the boards, obstructing the views for up to 3,000 spectators.¹⁹

When the Coyotes were sold to a partnership led by Steve Ellman, that group committed to building a new arena in suburban Glendale. Originally promised to open in 2001, Glendale Arena opened midway through the 2003–04 season, on December 26, 2003, with the Arizona Sting of the National Lacrosse League defeating the Vancouver Ravens, 16–12; the first NHL game was held the next evening, as the Coyotes dropped a 3–1 decision to the Nashville Predators.

Jobing.com Arena was expected to gain the 2009 NHL All-Star Game after losing the 2006 All-Star Game because of the new Collective Bargaining Agreement ratification in the National Hockey League; however the Montreal Canadiens and their arena, Bell Centre, were awarded the 2009 All-Star Game. Under the terms of the new agreement, the All-Star Game would not be held during the year of the Winter Olympics in order for players to participate in the Games. Philips Arena in Atlanta, which lost the All-Star Game in 2005 because of the lockout, was awarded the 2008 All-Star Game. However, in 2011, the arena might host the All-Star game.

Beginning in 2005, Jobing.com Arena has been host to the Arizona state high school basketball, volleyball, wrestling and cheerleading tournaments in a mega-event called "February Frenzy", as the result of a formal agreement between the city of Glendale and the Arizona Interscholastic Association (AIA).

There are 87 Luxury Suites at Jobing.com Arena, which includes two Luxury Tower Suites and 12 Luxury Party Suites that can accommodate large groups of up to 50 people. In addition, the Comerica Bank Club (located on the Club Suites level) consists of approximately 400 upscale seats with unique club and dining opportunities. The Toyota Club (located directly behind the Coyotes and visiting team player benches) offers guests an up close and personal experience combined with first-class hospitality services.

Jobing.com Arena has hosted some of the biggest names in entertainment today including Andrea Bocelli, Bon Jovi, Bruce Springsteen, Christina Aguilera, The Eagles, Elton John, Faith Hill & Tim McGraw, Foo Fighters, Hannah Montana, Justin Timberlake, Madonna, Mannheim Steamroller, Paul McCartney, Red Hot Chili Peppers, The Rolling Stones, Stevie Wonder, Tom Petty & the Heartbreakers, U2 and Van Halen.²⁰

Arena Non-Hockey Events

The chart below is the expected number of non-anchor (i.e. events besides the Phoenix Coyotes) in Jobing.com Arena and Phoenix Suns and the Phoenix Road Runners at US Airways Center) events to take place during the months of December 2008 and April 2009. As of December 15, 2008, the Jobing.com Arena had 10 non-anchor events planned for the facility where as the US Airways Center had a total of 21 non-anchor events. This fact coupled with the US Airways Center currently hosting 3 year round anchor tenants, the Phoenix Suns of the National Basketball Association, the Phoenix Mercury of the Women's National Basketball Association and the Phoenix Road Runners of the East Coast Hockey League highlights an underlining source of the revenue short fall at Jobing.com Arena, a lack of overall events. During the months of December to April the management team of Jobing.com Arena in charge of driving events to the center was only able to bring a total of 39 events, including the anchor tenant Phoenix Coyotes.

Phoenix Market

Phoenix is the capital and largest city in the U.S. state of Arizona, as well as the fifth most populous city in the United States. Phoenix is home to 1,552,259 residents and is the anchor of the Phoenix Metropolitan Area, the 12th largest metro area by population in the United States with 4,169,327²¹ residents. In addition, Phoenix is the county seat of Maricopa County and is one of the largest cities in the United States in terms of land area.

Phoenix's economy has primarily been dominated by agricultural, dependent mainly on cotton and citrus farming. In the last two decades, the economy has diversified and shifted as the population of the area has grown. Arizona State University has also enhanced the area's population through education and its growing research capabilities. Several high-tech and telecommunications companies, Intel and Boeing, have also recently relocated to the area. Due to the warm climate in winter, Phoenix receives an influx of people from tourism and vacationers, especially benefiting the golf industry.

Phoenix is currently home to seven Fortune 1000 companies: waste management company Allied Waste, electronics corporation Avnet, Apollo Group (which operates the University of Phoenix), mining company Freeport-McMoRan (recently merged with Phoenix based Phelps Dodge), Boeing and Intel. Honeywell's Aerospace division is headquartered in Phoenix, and the valley hosts many of their avionics and mechanical facilities. Intel has one of their largest sites here, employing about 8,000 employees and 3 chip manufactures, including a \$3 billion state-of-the-art facility. American Express hosts their financial transactions, customer information, and their entire website in Phoenix. The city is also home to the headquarters of U-HAUL International, a rental company and moving supply store, as well Best Western, a hotel chain. Mesa Air Group, a regional airline group, is headquartered in Phoenix.

The military has a significant presence in Phoenix with Luke Air Force Base located in the western suburbs. At its height, in the 1940s, the Phoenix area had three military bases: Luke Field (still in use), Falcon Field, and Williams Air Force Base (now Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport), with numerous auxiliary air fields located throughout the region.

Media Outlets

Phoenix is served by two major daily newspapers: *The Arizona Republic* (serving the greater metropolitan area) and the *East Valley Tribune* (serving primarily the cities of the East Valley). In addition, the city is also served by numerous free neighborhood papers and weeklies such as the *Phoenix New Times*, Arizona State University's *The State Press*, and the *College Times*.²⁴

The Phoenix metro area is served by numerous local television stations and is the 14th largest designated market area (DMA) in the U.S. with 1,660,430 homes (1.5% of the total U.S.) in 2003. Despite being the 12th largest TV market in the US within the NHL, the Phoenix Coyotes management has one of the lowest revenue levels from its local television broadcast. KTVK 3 (3TV) and KAZT 7 (AZ-TV) are independent television stations operating in the metro area. KAZT broadcasts in digital format only.²⁸

Nielsen Media Research ranks the Phoenix the 15 largest market in spring 2005 for radio. The radio market in the greater Phoenix area has a listening population of 2.8 million people a day.²⁹

Accessibility to Venue

<u>Airports</u>

Phoenix owns and operates three airports. Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport is the economic engine of the entire state of Arizona, contributing more than \$33 billion to Arizona's economy each year and employing more than 33,000 people. There are hundreds of nonstop and connecting flights from points around the globe each day.³⁰

Phoenix is served by Sky Harbor International Airport which is centrally located in the metro area near several major freeway interchanges east of downtown Phoenix. Sky Harbor is the ninth-busiest airport in the U.S. and 17th in the world for passenger traffic, handling more than 42 million travelers in 2007. The airport serves more than 100 cities with non-stop flights. AeroMexico, Air Canada, British Airways, and WestJet are among several international carriers as well as American carrier US Airways providing flights to destinations such as Canada, Costa Rica, and Mexico.³¹

The Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport in neighboring Mesa also serves the area's commercial air traffic. It was converted from Williams Air Force Base, which closed in 1993. The airport has recently received substantial commercial service with Allegiant Air opening a focus city operation at the airport with non-stop service to over a dozen destinations.

Smaller airports that primarily handle private and corporate jets include Phoenix Deer Valley Airport located in the Deer Valley district of northwest Phoenix, as well as municipal airports including Glendale Municipal Airport and Phoenix Goodyear Airport.

<u>Highways</u>

Loop 101 begins as the Agua Fria Freeway west of Phoenix in Tolleson at a three-level interchange with Interstate 10. From that point, it heads north through Glendale, passing the University of Phoenix Stadium and Jobing.com Arena. Continuing northward through Peoria, it passes the Peoria Sports Complex before heading east just past the Arrowhead Towne Center mall. Loop 101 is now heading eastward on the Beardsley Road alignment. The freeway enters North Phoenix, and at milepost 23, Loop 101 intersects Interstate 17 near the Deer Valley Airport, 15 miles (24 km) north of Downtown Phoenix.

Continuing east as the Pima Freeway, it passes through the Union Hills area and then has an interchange with the northern terminus of SR 51 at milepost 30. The freeway provides access

to Downtown Scottsdale, a large open-air power center called Scottsdale Pavilions, Scottsdale Community College, the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community (and its two casinos), and Scottsdale Fashion Square. Continuing south, Loop 101 encounters an interchange with the Red Mountain Freeway portion of Loop 202 in Tempe at milepost 51, near the campus of Arizona State University. This interchange is partially built over the Salt River.

After this interchange, Loop 101 is now the Price Freeway, and interchanges with US 60 at milepost 55 before entering Chandler. Loop 101 provides access to Chandler Fashion Center just prior to concluding at milepost 61 at an interchange with the Santa Freeway portion of Loop 202.

Purchased Assets:

The Purchased Assets would include, without limitation:

NHL's attendance, TV ratings both showing increases

For the first time since the 2004-05 lockout, the NHL has increased both its attendance and ratings at the midpoint of a season.

Through 628 games this season, average reported attendance is up 1.5 percent from 2007-08. The increase came despite the fact that the 2009 Winter Classic in Chicago at Wrigley Field held 30,000 fewer fans than the 2008 outdoor game in Buffalo, a game that drew 71,000.

"We're particularly pleased this year because the world around us is a lot different than it's been in a long time," said NHL Deputy Commissioner Bill Daly. "Most businesses would have reasons to be concerned about a downtum, and so far we haven't seen it."

The league increased its attendance in part because 10 of its clubs played to 100 percent capacity during the first half of the season. It also benefited from significant increases in average reported attendance in Chicago, Washington and Boston.

The Chicago Blackhawks led all teams in attendance, averaging 21,592 (excluding the game at Wrigley Fleid on Jan. 1). That made for a league-high 42 percent increase in reported attendance. The team also led the league in paid attendance increases, with a jump of more than 60 percent from 2007-08, according to league sources.

The success in Chicago comes in Rocky Wirtz's first complete season as chairman of the team. After taking over the club in October 2007 after his father's death, Wirtz brought in former Cubs President John McDonough, who overhauled the front office and reinvigorated the franchise with new marketing and locally televised games.

"A strong Chicago market with fan interest is important to the league, and (the Blackhawks') ability to reconnect with their fan base, which never left, has been nothing short of amazing," Daly said. "They're hitting on all cylinders and the fans have embraced what they bring to the rink every night."

The Washington Capitals saw attendance increase 29.8 percent to an average of 17,959, and as of Jan. 9, the team had increased its paid attendance by 37 percent, putting it in the top 10 in paid admissions, according to league sources. The Boston 8 ruins increased average attendance 12.3 percent to 16,692.

All six Canadian clubs continued to play to capacity, as did the Minnesota Wild, Pittsburgh Penguins, New York Rangers and the Blackhawks.

The league's success in those markets was partly offset by low attendance elsewhere. Five teams reported average attendance below 15,000 — the New York Islanders, Columbus Blue Jackets, Atlanta Thrashers, Nashville Predators and Phoenix Coyotes. The Islanders averaged a league-low 13,462. The other four teams averaged between 14,000 and 15,000 a game.



Ratings also increased in Canada where the CBC averaged 868,000 viewers a game through 34 telecasts. That number is up from 850,000 viewers a game in 2007-08 but down from 1 million viewers in 2006-07. TSN averaged 483,000 viewers, a 7.2 percent increase, and RDS averaged 648,000 viewers, a 31 percent increase.

Local ratings rose in 15 of 22 markets in the U.S., according to Nielsen data obtained by sources. (The Nashville Predators and Carolina Hurricanes ratings weren't available.) The Buffalo Sabres led the league with an 8.87 average local rating per game, and the Pittsburgh Penguins were the second highest with a 6.14 average. The Florida Panthers averaged a league-low 0.15 local rating, while the Islanders had a 0.17 average.
